breaks ground

on Energy Center in Lakeville

Dakota Electric officially broke ground in June on a new headquarters facility in Lakeville, marking the start of an exciting new chapter for the cooperative.

The new Energy Center will be located off 225th Street West and Cedar Avenue — just a few miles from the current headquarters in Farmington — and is expected to be operational by summer 2027. The 210,000-square-foot facility will bring all employees, vehicles, dispatch and operations under one roof to better serve the growing needs of our members.

Dakota Electric has called Farmington home since 1937, when the cooperative was founded by a group of local farmers. The current headquarters, built in 1978, no



longer meets operational needs. Over the years, the cooperative has grown from 15,000 members to more than 120,000 and now maintains over 4,000 miles of electric line.

"We're deeply grateful for Farmington's support over the years," said CEO Ryan Hentges. "We're excited to continue our strong tradition of service in a new facility designed to meet today's needs and support tomorrow's energy goals."

The new site will include improved equipment and vehicle storage, and areas for future expansion.

"This is more than just a building," Hentges said. "It's a center for energy leadership and innovation — a place where our members, employees and communities can come together to plan for the future of energy."

Dakota Electric looks forward to continuing its strong partnerships with both Farmington and Lakeville, and to providing safe, reliable and affordable electric service to members for generations to come.

Know what's **below**

Monday, August 11 is National 811 Day. Always call 811 before digging — it's the law. Utility lines may be just inches below the surface, and hitting one could cause outages, damage or even an explosion.

To dig safely — and legally in Minnesota — you need to do three things:

- Call 811 at least two business days before you dig.
- Mark your yard (in white) so the locator knows where you're digging and can mark the utilities in your yard appropriately.
- Respect the locate marks and hand-dig carefully around them.

Utility locators follow the uniform color codes mandated by the American Public Works Association (APWA) for locate marks.



Rate case update


On June 6, Dakota Electric and the parties to our rate case signed a Settlement Agreement that, if approved by the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission, would reduce our requested rate increase from \$23.81 million (11.0%) to \$20.88 million (9.62%).

The agreement also includes updates to Dakota Electric's terms of service, including time-of-use periods. We'll share more details in the coming months ahead of the new rates, expected to take effect in early 2026.

The first change affects our electric vehicle (EV) time-of-use rate. Since 2012, this rate has offered lower pricing for off-peak charging. To better align with shifting peak demand, the off-peak period will shift from 9 p.m.–8 a.m. to 10 p.m.–7 a.m., Monday through Friday (excluding holidays and including weekends). A new morning peak period from 7–9 a.m. will also be added.
